Why Communion Every Week @ FCC?

At Communion, Christians meditate upon the sacrifice of Jesus for their salvation. They examine themselves to ascertain if they have grown in the grace and knowledge of Christ during the past week. They reaffirm their covenant with God: to love Him with all their heart, soul, mind, and strength. Communion is the only way Jesus Himself asked to be remembered. Let us come together on this Lord's Day and every Lord's Day to remember and celebrate His mercy in the Lord's Supper as we commune together.



"The Lord Jesus on the same night in which He was betrayed took bread; and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, 'This is My body which is

broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me.' In the same manner, He also took the cup after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.' For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till He comes." (1 Cor. 11:23-26)

Those who miss the opportunity to partake of the Lord's Supper during Sunday morning worship or who wish to partake more frequently are encouraged to take advantage of individual communion provided in the chapel at the conclusion of Sunday school and on Sunday and Wednesday evenings following services.

Do you want to be right with God and have a fresh start?

The solution is as simple as **ABCD**:

A: Admit that you have sinned and need a Savior.

"All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God... The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus." (Romans 3:23, 6:23)

<u>B:</u> Believe that God's only Son, Jesus, was crucified and died to pay for your sins and rose from the dead so that you can have forgiveness from God and receive eternal life.

"God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." (John 3:16)

C: Confess your faith that Jesus is Lord upon repenting of your sins, and be baptized.

"If you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved." (Romans 10:9)

"Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." (Acts 2:38)

D: Dedicate yourself to God's Word and His people.

"They continued...in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in breaking of bread, and in prayers." (Acts 2:42)
